## Minutes of the Walker City Council Monday, February 14, 2022 Walker City Council Chambers

Mayor Bamrick called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Council Present: Paul Nielsen, John Pint, Jessica Hammerand, and Rob Dunn. Absent: Dianna Thorp.

Others Present: Will Sherbon, Rozena McVey, Mike Becker, Thera McEnany, Tina Chapman, Austin Prose, and Lee Cherry.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Bamrick.

Motion/Second by Nielsen/Pint to approve the Consent Agenda which includes the following: 2-14-22 agenda, 1-10-22 minutes, accounts payable, and January payroll reports. 4 ayes, 1 absent, motion carried.

Public Hearing – Proposed Property Tax Levy for FY23: Opened at 7:05 pm. The clerk did not receive any verbal or written comments. Tina Chapman asked if the increase in taxes is due to the wage increases for the employees. Mayor Bamrick explained how wages are split to different departments, so only approximately 25% of the increase would be paid from these funds. In addition, these levies are increasing by 10 cents, however, the overall tax levy is only increasing 1.6 cents per thousand of taxable valuation. Thera McEnany and Tina Chapman also inquired as to the duties performed by the employees on a daily basis. Discussion held regarding this. Closed at 7:37 pm.

Linn County Sheriff's Report: We contract for 14 hours per week. They have exceeded the required hours for the last month.

Mayor: No permits were issued.

Discussion held regarding the requirements for water and sewer connections at 119 Greene St. for East Buchanan Telephone Cooperative. Council would like to consider further and have this item placed on the March 14, 2022, agenda.

Motion/Second by Dunn/Nielsen to approve Resolution 2022-6 – Resolution Approving FY22 Fund Transfers. Roll call vote: ayes: Dunn, Pint, Hammerand, Nielsen. Absent: Thorp. Motion carried.

Just a reminder that ATV's and snowmobiles are not to be ridden in the City right of way (the area between the street and the actual property line – the ditch) or on any city property. We are seeing tracks and just wanted to remind everyone of the ordinances.
