## Minutes of the Walker City Council Monday, March 11, 2024 Walker City Council Chambers

Mayor Bamrick called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Council Present: Paul Nielsen, Jonathan Wolff, Abagail Wells, Rob Dunn, and Kyle Glenn.

Others Present: Ted Beuter, Will Sherbon, Kevin Shoop, Bill Avis, Scot McEnany, Brian and Lori Prucha from Rudd Sanitation, and Linn Co. Deputy Williams.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Bamrick.

Motion/Second by Wolff/Nielsen to approve the Consent Agenda which includes the following: 3-11-24 agenda, 2-12-24 minutes, 2-26-24 minutes, accounts payable, and February payroll reports. 5 ayes, motion carried.

## Public Hearings:

Ordinance 370 – An Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Walker, Iowa by Amending Provisions Pertaining to Water Rates: Opened at 7:00 pm. The clerk did not receive any written or verbal comments. No citizens present with comments. Closed at 7:01 pm.

Ordinance 371 – An Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Walker, Iowa by Amending Provisions Pertaining to Sewer Service Charges. Opened at 7:01 pm. The clerk did not receive any written or verbal comments. No citizens present with comments. Closed at 7:02 pm.

Ordinance 372 – An Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Walker, Iowa by Amending Provisions Pertaining to Council Compensation. Opened at 7:02 pm. The clerk did receive the following comment: Understand \$50.00 for each regular council meeting, but do not think they should be paid \$50.00 for special meetings as they are often short. No citizens present with comments. Closed at 7:04 pm.

Linn County Sheriff's Report: We contract for 14 hours per week. They have exceeded the required hours for the last month.

Rudd Sanitation, Lori Prucha: On July 1, 2024, the landfill is increasing dumping prices as follows: garbage going from \$45/ton to \$48/ton and recycling going from \$95/ton to \$110/ton. Due to this, they will be increasing the contract price, and we have 2 options. Option 1: \$.50 increase per month, remove recycling, and go from two 35-gallon cans to three 35-gallons cans per week. Option 2: Keep recycling and garbage at two 35-gallon cans with a price increase of \$1.50/month. They are leaving it up to each city they contract with to decide which option they want. This will be placed on the April 8, 2024, agenda for discussion. We will try to get the information out to the public so we can get input at that meeting from the citizens regarding their preference.

Mayor: 3 permits were issued – 1 pergola, 2 new houses.

Clerk: Written report is available at City Hall. February gross payroll: \$13,341.51. The ending balance on February 29, 2024, was \$1,073,155.76.

Public Works Technician: Written report is available at City Hall. An update was also given on the Linn County ARPA Grant.

Fire Dept: There were 5 calls for service in the past month – 1 fire and 4 medical calls.

Council/ Committee Reports: Councilmember Nielsen stated he has reviewed and signed off on all of the financial reports.

Planning & Zoning Commission: They continue to work on updating Chapter 165/Zoning and will continue to work on this. They have discussed things such as solar panels and windmills. Connie stated she got copies of the maps they asked for and has been updating them as they have asked. They are ready for them to review at their next meeting.

Motion/Second by Glenn/Wells to suspend the rules and waive the second and third readings of Ordinance 371. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Wolff, Nielsen, Glenn, Wells, Dunn. Motion carried. Ordinance passes.

Ordinance 372 - An Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Walker, Iowa by Amending Provisions Pertaining to Council Compensation is dropped due to lack of motion/second to approve the first reading.

Motion/Second by Glenn/Wolff to adopt Resolution 2024-8 – Resolution Accepting the Greene Street Water Main Replacement Project. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Glenn, Wells, Dunn, Wolff, Nielsen. Motion carried.

Motion/Second by Dunn/Glenn to approve the updated by-laws for the Walker Fire Department. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Motion/Second by Wolff/Glenn to approve the use of the City Park for the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, March 30, 2024, at 10 am. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Motion/Second by Wolff/Wells to approve the Iowa Women's Softball League Contract for July 14, 2024, and July 21, 2024, with a fee of \$200.00. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Ted Beuter presented projects the Little League would like to do at the ballpark this year. They are going to be putting steel on the batting cage building. The estimate is \$980.00, and Little League is going to pay for this project. They are also going to add cement along the first and third base lines in front of the bleachers and from the bleachers to the concession stand. The estimate they have received is \$3,000.00. The Little League has committed \$3,000.00 to this project, so if the cost exceeds this amount, they will ask the city to cover the balance. And finally, they want to paint the concession stand as it is starting to show some wear. The Little League will pay for the paint and is asking the city to provide some labor/volunteer labor to get this done. Motion/Second by Wolff/Dunn to approve the projects as presented. 5 ayes, motion carried.
